

Title I Expenditures

FY 14-15 Allocation \$394,528

Title I is a federal program to help all students get a quality education and meet academic standards. Schools with 40% or more of children from low-income families qualify for school-wide Title I programs. Guntersville Elementary, Cherokee Elementary, and Guntersville Middle are all School-wide Title Schools.

Title I funds are distributed as they are earned per pupil to Guntersville Elementary, Cherokee Elementary, and Guntersville Middle Schools. These funds are used to hire teachers, instructional aides, and after school and summer tutors.

Title I funds are used to purchase:

- Instructional Materials and Supplies
- Computer Hardware and Software
- Parent Involvement Materials
- Scientifically Research Based Programs
- Professional Development of Teachers and Administrators

Title II Expenditures

FY 13-14 Allocation \$68,322

Title II is a federal program funding high quality professional development for teachers and administrators. It is used to prepare, train and recruit highly qualified teachers and administrators for their work with students in Guntersville City Schools.

- Class Size Reduction Teacher \$53,861.72
- Professional Development \$14,460.28

Title VI Expenditures

FY 13-14 Allocation \$40,130

Title VI funds provide financial assistance to rural districts to assist them in meeting their state's definition of adequate yearly progress (AYP). Applicants do not compete but rather are entitled to funds if they meet basic eligibility requirements. Eligibility is restricted by statute. Guntersville High School receives these funds

- Instructional aide to help with at-risk students
- Computer Equipment
- Professional Development
- Classroom Instructional Supplies
